BUILDING & DEVELOPMENT PERMIT APPLICATIONS

Time for a project? In order to build/develop projects on your property, you may need a Permit. See FORMS page on the website for basic Building & Development Permit needed for all projects, and then specific ones for decks, garages, homes, additions, moves, etc. Permits are sent to inspector for review and approval, and then fees are assessed. Fees must be paid before your permit is issued by the Town Office. If you have a project in process, be sure to contact inspector regarding inspections as work is completed.

BYLAWS

Town bylaws are available on the website, so if you have questions about zoning, nuisance, animals, parking, noise, and more, go there first. If you have a concern about one of these matters, reference the relevant bylaws in your written complaint form (on website).
