Town Council is excited to announce that we now have the keys for the new Community Centre. The Town has received financing for the purchase price of the facility which allows for the deferred maintenance to be addressed with funds from reserves. Here is SOME of what we are working on to make the Community Centre a great community gathering place: Multiple grant applications are in the works to support various projects.

- The Town is currently working with Firebird Business Consulting to develop a business plan and strategy for a sustainable future.
- An engineering firm has been contracted and the design for the replacement of the Administration/Main Building roof has started.
- The Town is in the process of hiring facility staff.
- Council has begun reaching out to stakeholders for potential financial partnerships.
- Council and Thrive are close to having an agreement in place for the 2021-2022 school year for rental of space in the Community Centre.
- Council is supporting the creation of a separate non-profit childcare hub within the facility, as this is a muchneeded community service.

We have already had our first rentals and with restrictions being lifted there will be many more to come! *Stay tuned for information on future community involvement opportunities such as a work bee and a fundraising committee.*
