Please Only Flush Toilet Paper

Everyone loves the convenience of indoor plumbing but what happens



after you flush? Are you aware that some of the things you think nothing of flushing down the toilet are causing major problems for our Public Works Crew and putting our Town infrastructure in jeopardy? Check this out!

"Flushable" wipes and other bathroom convenience products are not flushable at all! The first photo (provided by APWA Resource) is a jar of water with toilet paper in it from 2018 side by side with a jar of water with some flushable wipes from the same year. The toilet paper has broken down, allowing it to pass safely through the system but the flushable wipe lives on years later!

Where does it go? What happens? Check out the photo of a recent blockage in one of our Town's manholes. Blockages of foreign objects are extremely costly and damage Town infrastructure. These blockages can result in SEWER backing up into yours or one of your neighbour's houses!

A good rule of thumb is, TOILET=TOILET PAPER ONLY. Help us protect our Town assets and prevent sewer back ups! If you have any questions, please call the Town Office at 306-947-2170
