Artificial Ice?

Jillian Brown from Hepburn was a delegation to the Council Meeting and proposed that a new committee be formed to investigate the possibility of having artificial ice installed in Hepburn Arena. Council thanked her group for their vision, expressed interest in continuing the discussion, and will draft Terms of Reference for this new Committee created.

Snow Removal Policy

Council will review the *Snow Removal Policy* at January 22 Meeting to determine if any changes are required, specifically length of day that snow clearing operations are permitted, definition of a major snow event, and clearing priorities at Heritage Common & Hepburn Arena to allow customers to access these facilities.

2025 Assessment

Council appointed Western Municipal Consulting as the 2025 Board of Revision regarding Assessment Appeals. **2025 is a re-assessment year** where every property in Hepburn will have a revised property assessment. Council has invited the Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency to meet with Council and review the 2025 assessments. Property Taxes are based to some degree on property assessment.
