Fire Safety & Recreational Fires

With the weather warming up, remember to follow Town Bylaws regarding proper burning:

. **Open-Air Fires 18.1:** (a) Fires shall be contained in a non-combustible receptacle constructed of cement, brick or sheet metal with a minimum 18-gauge thickness; (b) A receptacle shall be covered with a heavy gauge screen with openings not exceeding 13 millimetres; and (c) The size of the fire box of any receptacle shall not exceed 1.2 meters. Sewer Blockages

If you experience a sewer blockage, call the office during business hours, or the emergency on call phone after hours -BEFORE taking any



action. Section 31 of Utility Management Bylaw states: "The Town expects that the owner will immediately contact Town Administration or Public Works staff prior to any work being undertaken. If no contact is made with the Town prior to the contractor commencing work, the Town will not take on the responsibility for any of the billing relative to repair work that is done. Any contractor hired to do work in the Town will need to be vetted by the Town prior to commencing work or the Town will not take responsibility for any of the billing."

April Council Meeting Updates

New Councillor

Deb McGuire, Town of Hepburn's newest Councillor, took her Oath of Office at the April 16 Council Meeting.



Strategic Plan Updates

A Request for Proposals for **Residential Land Development** at Heritage Common was authorized. This would see the Music Wing Building demolished, and an opportunity for multi-family buildings on the grounds. The 2nd Project would be the North Court Parcel, with a potential for redevelopment of the existing building. This is a project under *Strategic Objective 2.1 - Heritage Common Event Centre* becoming self-sufficient and enhancing its role as a gathering place in the community.

A Structural Analysis of the Hepburn Arena by Associated Engineering was authorized. This is a project under *Strategic Objective 1.4 - Artificial Ice at the Arena.*

Application for Canada Housing Infrastructure Fund that was due by March 31, 2025 to upgrade the capacity of *the Lagoon to allow for growth* was submitted by the deadline. This is a project under *Strategic Objective* 1.1 - *Engineering Assessment of New Lagoon project*.

The Town is excited to announce the start of the Community Social Media, Digital Marketing, and Economic Development contract in April. This project will raise awareness of the amazing potential of Hepburn. Look for digital content of Mayor Baerwald explaining this new initiative including the Business Retention and Expansion Project. This is an initiative under *Strategic Objective 2.2 -Marketing/Tourism/Promotion of Hepburn.*

Twin Rivers District won a <u>Saskatchewan Municipal</u> <u>Award for Regional Cooperation</u> – in recognition of the Fire Chief Collaboration, EMO Committee, and Community Safety Officer Program.
