Green & Inclusive Community Buildings (GICB)



UPDATE: The **Solar Project** underway on Heritage Common North Field is part of the large Green and Inclusive Community Buildings Grant (GICB) the town received as of April 2021. The total

project amount is \$2.3 million, with 80% being federally funded and 20% municipally funded. This project was built into town budget plans for 2021 until the projects are complete, likely in 2026. The total grant covers green energy improvement renovations, including windows, doors, HVAC, solar, LED lighting, and accessibility features.

Council Meeting Highlights - May

Strategic Plan Updates (2025-2030): The plan is building Hepburn to be: "a *dynamic, thriving community* where amenities support our growth and contribute to a high quality of life for all current and future residents. We are committed to embracing sustainable and green growth, creating an environment where developers and businesses thrive."

Economic Development & Community

Marketing Initiative: First up is a Business

Retention and Expansion Survey to better understand our dedicated local businesses who do so much for the town. The surveys are confidential and a final report will be made public in late June. Watch new Hepburn Promotional Video:

Summer Maintenance: Work is underway with a

full crew and emphasis on the appearance of Hepburn. There is a plan to open 1st Street East as a pedestrian corridor from Museum of Wheat to Main Street to Heritage Common. Look for more flowers and planters to create this esthetically pleasing pathway.



Reassessment & Mill Rate: Because this is an assessment year, properties saw an overall increase: ***Commercial/Industrial 17%** increase in assessment; ***Agricultural 13%** increase in assessment; & ***Residential 10%** increase in assessment. The goal was to ensure that most property owners would see a 2025 municipal property tax bill similar to 2024, plus a 3% increase. This is difficult as properties with assessment that increased more than 10% residentially would see a larger increase than 3%. Conversely, properties that assessment increased less than 10% would see a lessor increase than 3%. To achieve this, the Town was able to keep the **increase in the mill rate to just 0.2 mills from 5.4 mills to 5.6 mills** with the following factors:

	2025	2024
Commercial/Industrial	1.4	1.4
Agricultural	1.3	1.3
Residential	1.01	1.01

There will be *no increase in the 2025 base tax* and that softens the impact - for example, a 12% increase in property taxes equates to just over \$29 monthly. The assessment portion of your *municipal property tax bill* is less than 40% of the **total** municipal property taxes, as the remainder is the base tax. *Property Tax Notices will be sent in early July 2024.*

Progress on Strategic Goals: Progress continues towards 2025 to 2030 Strategic Plan with 2025 Budget:

- Request for proposals to redevelop existing properties at Heritage Common have closed with promising proposals received.
- First phases of long-term paving program have been determined, waiting estimates.
- Application made under the Canada Housing Infrastructure Fund (CHIF) to assist in funding a lagoon expansion project required for community growth, waiting response.
- Preparing for a Wheatland Regional Library Branch in 2026.
- Preparing for fitness centre in Fall 2025. Quotes received and in-budget.
- Structural analysis on the Hepburn Arena to determine longevity of the facility completed.
- Conventional & digital marketing to make Heritage Common self-sustaining, with Hepburn video content.
- Emphasis on economic development and actively marketing the community.
- Partnerships with regional neighbours encouraging development and growth.
