All Terrain Vehicles Act (ATV)

*ATVs should not be operated on any town property and parks.

*All Drivers and Passengers should use helmets and eye protection.

*Drivers should have a valid drivers license and be able to produce it if approached by the Community Safety Officer.

*Young drivers (without a drivers license and with a safety course) must be under the supervision of a parent/guardian.

Swimming Pool Info (Zoning Bylaw, page 38).

Please note: "No part of such pool is located closer to any lot or street line than the minimum distance required

for the principal building located on such lot. The maximum height of such pool is 1.2 meters (4 feet) above the average finished grade level of the ground adjoining the pool and to within 4.5 meters of such pool. Every swimming pool shall be enclosed by a nonclimbable fence of at least 1.8 meters (5.9 feet) in height and not more than 10 cm from the ground, and located at a distance of not less than 1.5 meters (5 feet) from the pool. Any deck attached to or abutting a swimming pool shall be considered as part of the swimming pool."

Fires shall be contained in a **noncombustible receptacle**....of cement, brick or sheet metal with a min 18-

gauge thickness...be **covered with a heavy gauge screen** with openings not exceeding 13mm; and size shall not exceed 1.2m:

Green & Inclusive Community Buildings (GICB) UPDATE: The Solar Project

underway on Heritage Common North Field is part of the **Green and**



Inclusive Community Buildings Grant (GICB) that the town received April 2021. <u>Fencing around the solar</u> <u>project has been completed.</u> The total project amount is \$2.3 million, with 80% being federally funded and 20% municipally funded. The total grant covers green energy improvement renovations, including windows, doors, HVAC, solar, LED lighting, and accessibility features.
