Emergency Preparedness Matters!

The Town of Hepburn is currently updating emergency plans, including local resources listed below:

Emergency planning for water search and rescue or snowstorm emergencies may require the assistance of owners and their machinery. Because Hepburn is member of the Twin Rivers Emergency Measures

Organization (EMO) Committee, Hepburn resources might be requested to be shared with surrounding locations. When residents call in to the town office, provide contact info: name; cell number; and details of licensed / registered boats and snowmobiles. The person calling must be an equipment owner.

COUNCIL UPDATES



Council Meeting Highlights – July

1. Major milestones of the <u>2025</u> to 2030 Strategic Plan – Over

the Rise to our Bright Future were achieved with the presentation of the following documents:

- Business Retention and Expansion Survey (BR&E) - This in-depth survey with Hepburn businesses was completed to determine how the Town can best support its local businesses.
- The Town of Hepburn and Heritage Common long-term Marketing Plan.

A Special Council Meeting will be held to discuss the recommendations and action plans, which will then be subsequently released.

- 2. Another major milestone of the Strategic Plan Phase 1 of the long-term Asphalt Program starts August 4, 2025, as Canadian Paving will complete preventative maintenance and repairs on existing asphalt surfaces to protect the surface and ensure longevity. Pothole repairs, crack-sealing, and seal coating maintenance on the following asphalt surfaces is scheduled to start Monday, August 4, 2025.
 - Seal coating of Main Street, Heritage Place, Willow Place, Poplar Place, Crocus Court, & Albert Place.
 - Patch broken and sunken areas on Main Street and 1st St. East
 - Chip sealing of Railway Street from 2nd Avenue South to just past Albert Place, and the section in front of Heritage Street

This work is expected to take most of that week and people are reminded to move vehicles, waste and recycling receptacles off the streets. Traffic will be disrupted and we thank everyone for their patience.

3. Two Isolation Valves have been installed on Railway Street near the Reservoir on July 28 & 29, 2025. *This is a major system enhancement* as it will allow the Town to isolate sections of the water system when there are issues. The previous system was such that if there was work to be completed at the Reservoir, the entire Town water supply had to be turned off.
