Tree Trimming Reminder

Ratepayers are required to keep trees trimmed along roadways and back alleys. Branches must be cut back, so they do not interfere with vehicles or equipment. Note the grader is approximately three times taller than a standard truck, so trim accordingly.

We kindly remind residents that offroad vehicles are not permitted on
town-owned properties. Driving on
grass or through treed areas creates ruts and compacts
the ground, making these spaces difficult to maintain.

GRANT UPDATE - <u>Solar Panel connections to the</u> <u>main building are underway and we look forward to the</u> <u>power that will be generated.</u> This \$2.9 million project (80% federal, 20% municipal) is part of the **GICB Grant** that the town received April 2021, which covers green energy improvement renovations for windows, doors, HVAC, solar, LED lighting, and accessibility features.

<u>Council Meeting Highlights – August</u>

1.Major milestones of the 2025 to 2030 Strategic Plan – Over the Rise to our Bright Future were achieved with the acceptance of the following:



*Business Retention & Expansion Survey (BR&E):

The Survey Recommendations were approved and will enhance the relationship with local business by:

- 1. supporting local business to network, expand and grow;
- 2. attracting new business and services;
- 3. attracting new residents; and
- 4. exploring growth opportunities.

*Town of Hepburn and Heritage Common Long-Term Marketing Plan: The Plan Recommendations were approved and will promote and market Hepburn by:

- 1. Creating content and push out, using Artificial Intelligence supports;
- 2. Implementing digital marketing of Hepburn and Heritage Common;
- 3. Expanding website optimization and digital infrastructure; and
- 4. Supporting Influencer, Community, & Ambassador marketing.
- 2. In support of the Strategic Plan **Objective 2.2**Marketing Hepburn, Council approved a *property tax incentive program*. Rather than cancelling property taxes for a three or five year term for new single family home construction and ownership, the Town took an innovative approach by authorizing a grant in the amount of \$5,000 and continuing to charge property taxes. Those property taxes that would have been cancelled and cost the Town will be charged and used to fund the grant. This will cost less and is an attractive option to new homebuilders in Hepburn.
- 3. Thanks to all residents for their patience during Phase 1 of the Long-Term Asphalt Program. The project took longer than estimated due to the rain. **Objective 1.3 Road Pavement Program.**
- 4. Great news the structural analysis of the Hepburn & District Arena showed the building to be in excellent shape with an estimated 20-30 years lifespan. The work of the Artificial Ice Committee to determine feasibility of Artificial Ice can begin, Objective 1.4 of the Strategic Plan.
