Council Meeting Highlights - October

The Hepburn Fitness Centre is nearing completion with the final piece of equipment, the Power Body Multi Station Stack, arriving the week of November 3, 2025. Details about membership fees and rules will be released next week. However, to encourage new customers, there will be no charge to use this brand-new facility until January, 2026. Persons using the fitness centre will still have to sign the membership and waiver form. Please drop in The Town Office to sign the agreement and receive access.

- The Artificial Ice Committee met on October 16, 2025 and reviewed the structural analysis of the Hepburn Community Arena, discussed plans from 2012 to add a new dressing room area and toured the facility. There was agreement that a feasibility study should be completed and the Committee will meet again once engineering/architectural firms have submitted proposals.
- Town Council received a Business Incentive Package and referred to the 2026 Budget Deliberations. The Business Incentives proposed embraces our role as a bedroom community as well as encouraging existing business to expand and new business to locate here.
- 4. The Town has created a **New Home Grant Program** that makes Hepburn one of Saskatchewan's most affordable places to build!

The Town of Hepburn is taking bold steps to encourage community growth with the launch of a new incentive program: beginning in 2025, the purchaser of a newly constructed single-family residence in Hepburn will receive a \$5,000 grant.

Unlike traditional three- or five-year municipal property tax exemptions, this innovative approach provides **an immediate benefit to new homeowners** while saving the Town money in the long run.

Mayor Erica Baerwald shares the community's vision: "We are committed to responsible growth in Hepburn, and we know that every dollar makes a difference when you are building a new home. A brand-new home in Hepburn is already nearly \$100,000 less than in Saskatoon, Martensville, or Warman—with the added benefit of small town living and our lot size being larger than other towns and cities. Add this \$5,000 grant on top of that, and Hepburn becomes a truly prime location for families to build their future."

With affordability, space, and community spirit, Hepburn is ready to welcome new families and businesses.
